Term: Summer 2018

English / Literacy

Year 5 will be developing their discussion writing and persuasive writing using "Talk 4 Writing". Reading skills will be developed through weekly Guided Group Reading. Weekly spelling rules taught and practiced. Oracy skills developed through English and across the curriculum.

Maths

Number sequences, measuring and drawing angles, recognising acute and obtuse angles, making estimates, data handling, probability, ratio, fractions, time and algebra.
Weekly reasoning and problem solving activities.

Science

Develop skills, knowledge and understanding through the theme of 'Plants for Life' as well as our topic Land Down Under (Australia).

RE / Values Friendship and Respect

Bible - Getting to understand the basic chronology of the bible and appreciate how the laws of the ancient world are reflected in the Bible.

Church - Continuing to understand the importance of actions and symbols, understanding the 'family' of the church of wales in many countries.

Topic - Land Down Under (Australia)

- All skills taught in English, Maths and Science will be applied across the curriculum and through the topic of Bee Aware wherever possible.
